Achill Island Sea salt, An O'Malley Business

Achill based Maebh O'Malley is one of many O'Malley Clan members involved in Irelands expanding food industry. With her family she runs Achill Island Sea Salt. I caught up with Maebh on a recent visit to Achill.

Tell me about your own Food Business?

Achill Island Sea Salt is a family business, founded in July 2013. The inspiration for the business came from a documentary on sea salt and the desire to revive the age old but long forgotten tradition of salt production on the island which was alive up to the 1820's. In the time-honored tradition, we began in the family kitchen. Due to an increase in demand we have now moved to a custom modified factory on the island, allowing us to increase our production capacity.

The product is hand harvested from the Atlantic waters off Achill and is a 100% unrefined natural soft, flaky sea salt. We combine traditional production methods with modern technology, to produce is a 100% unrefined natural a sea salt with no preservatives or anti-caking agents and over 60 naturally occurring trace elements

Chefs particularly like our sea salt for its unique taste, texture and appearance. It has won numerous awards including a Euro-Toques Food Award, a Blas na hÉireann, a Great Taste Awards and also a prestigious McKenna Guide recommendation.

Who have been your Food Influencers?

JP McMahon of Aniar Restaurant, Galway. He manages to be chef, restaurateur and author along with a huge commitment to the educational aspects of food, supporting local and free-range produce, and engaging directly with small farmers

Jamie Oliver, whose 30 minute meals and many other projects opened so many eyes to proper food.

Share a little more about your O'Malley heritage

The O'Malley family in Keel, Achill, Co Mayo can trace their descendents back to the famine. My great-grandfather, John O'Malley (born 1900) had 5 brothers and one sister, all of whom emigrated to England, Australia and America. He started a tailoring business in Keel, Achill, Co Mayo in 1928. He had 2 sons, one emigrated to New York and the other my grandfather, Michael O'Malley (born 1930) carried on the tailoring business together with a shop and post office. He had 3 sons and 2 daughters. My uncle, John O'Malley (born 1956) continued with the family business until 2006. My father, Kieran O'Malley (born 1960), a teacher, my mother, my 2 brothers and I returned to live on Achill in 1999.

From Chicago to Ballyagran for a bet!!

The Grand Nephew of Mr Patrick O'Malley originally from Moher, Ballyagran, Co. Limerick sent us in this story which featured in the Cork Examiner in November 1939. Thanks for the submission to Jim O'Malley. Remember this bet took place in 1908 prior to transatlantic jet travel!


Patrick O'Malley, originally from Moher, Ballyagran, Co. Limerick emigrated to the US in around 1890 and settled in Chicago, where He became a prominent businessman, and member of the local Democratic Party organisation. He ran several saloons and "handbooks" (gambling games), and is said to have amassed significant wealth over the years.

His best known premises was in Dearborn Street which was said to have a daily turnover in betting of \$100,000.

His most famous exploit turned out to be a bet of \$1,000 he had with a Jim O'Leary, the biggest bookmaker in the docklands in Chicago.

The story goes that both men were having Champagne at a Democratic Party function in 1908 and that Mr O'Leary had commented that "it'd be a long time in Ireland before you'd get any stuff like this to drink" Patrick O'Malley countered saying that Champagne had been the regular tipple at his Father's table in Ballyagran County Limerick before He ever came to America. He bet O'Leary that He'd be at his parents table drinking Champagne within 1 week..

A fast train landed him at the docks in New York where He boarded the Luisitania with only 15 minutes to spare, from there He landed in Cobh, and hired a car to take him to his family home in Ballyagran, landing at the door after 167 hours, leaving 1 hour to spare!
