Jennifer Rose McMahon, Author

Jennifer Rose McMahon is an Irish-American author, living in Boston with her husband from Salthill, Galway and their four children. Her novel, BOHERMORE, set in Galway and Mayo, is scheduled for release in April 2017 through City Owl Press in New York City.

Jennifer's grandfather, Patrick Joseph O'Malley immigrated to the States in the early 1900's from a farm in Claremorris, County Mayo. Jennifer studied abroad at NUIG, fondly remembered as UCG, and lived on Bohermore in Galway City. She became fascinated with Ireland's Pirate Queen, Grace O'Malley, and was determined to bring her out of the darkness of history and back into everyone's awareness. Jennifer's O'Malley heritage and love for Ireland and its medieval history have inspired her creativity and her writing.



BOHERMORE Blurb:

When your dreams become reality, being cursed can be a real nightmare.

Like a punch in the face, eighteen-year-old Maeve O'Malley's visions knock her off her path. The Pirate Queen stalking Maeve in her dreams, killed her mother years ago, and now is coming for her.

Maeve's decision to ditch Boston College takes everyone by surprise as she packs her bags, leaves Boston, and heads to the west coast of Ireland to chase her dreams – and end them.

How long did it take you to write BOHERMORE?

I'd actually been thinking about writing BOHERMORE for almost twenty years and then, like an epiphany, it flew out of me three years ago. The editing and publishing process have dragged it out a bit, but now it's more than ready for its debut.

Which parts of Ireland did you use for the setting?


The main character, Maeve O'Malley, travels through the west coast - starting in Galway, visiting Clare and then ending in Mayo. Several locations will be recognized by locals such as:

Galway: NUIG, Salthill-Black Rock, Lynch's Castle, Aran Islands-Dun Aengus, Eyre Square, MacSwiggan's pub, and 122 Bohermore.

Doolin: O'Connors, pink sweater shop, Pinnacle Well, round tower

Mayo: Westport House, Rockfleet Castle, Claremorris and Warde's Pub.

So, the Pirate Queen in your novel, is it safe to say it's Grace O'Malley?



What kind of research did you need to do for BOHERMORE?

I used much of my personal experience and the things I loved most about my time in Ireland. The castles and ruins, as well as the legends and myths, were my favorite part. My imagination went wild any time I stepped foot in a medieval abbey or ancient cemetery with a sea of Celtic crosses.

I also read most of Anne Chambers' work and followed every link about Grace O'Malley I could find. That part was easy. Describing the perfect pint of Guinness...that was a labor of love.

Will you be writing anything else along these lines?

Yes. BOHERMORE is book one of the Pirate Queen Series. Book 2, INISH CLARE will be coming out in 2018 and Book 3, ROCKFLEET, is still in its infancy. The series follows Maeve's journey toward discovering her true family lineage and uncovering the curse that has plagued the O'Malley women for generations.


How can people contact you if they have questions about the series?


Tears poured from my eyes now as I gazed upon her intimidating posture and unworldly beauty. I froze to the core and stared, mouth hanging.
