King O'Malley—We have an update to the story!

Editor's Note: As can happen sometimes when we put an article into the monthly newsletter, an O'Malley out there around the world will get in touch to fill us in on the back story, and maybe let us know of the full history behind a person or a place. We had a brief article on the famous Australian politician King O'Malley in last month's issue, and thankfully Brian O'Malley from Canberra, Australia got in touch. He's done a lot of research work on the life and times of King O'Malley, and has even produced a book on the subject. Here's his "King O'Malley Update" Thanks Brian for all the hard work, and for getting in touch with us.

Hi – my name is Brian O'Malley and I live in Canberra. I read the article in the November edition of the Clan Newsletter about 'King' O'Malley. The article appears to draw heavily on the current Australian Dictionary of Biography entry about King O'Malley and, as noted, his early personal history is related as 'by his own account'. There is a very significant reason he obfuscated his past and it has remained unknown until now.

As an amateur genealogist, I've been researching my own family for about forty years or so, and while, as an Australian, I was aware of the politician 'King' O'Malley, he had never turned up

in any searches I did during that time. So about four years ago, I began researching whether or not I was related to him. His past, prior to arrival in Australia in July 1888, was always (intentionally) shrouded in mystery. Thus started a long journey which culminated in my recently published book - 'How James became King – The true story of James 'King' O'Malley.

Using an array of sources including O'Malley's personal archive of over 11,000 items he left to the National Library of Australia (NLA) collection, US Library of Congress newspaper records, several biographies of 'King' O'Malley, US and Australian contemporary newspaper sources, genealogical sites, and a wide range of other sources (the book contains over 700 references), I have traced 'King' O'Malley back to his roots in New Haven, Connecticut. Here, he was better known as the notorious James Malley Jr., the prime suspect in the infamous 1881 murder of Jennie Cramer. The inquest and trial were a notable sensation of the era, with newspaper coverage equal to that of the Jesse James saga of the period. James Malley's uncle Edward Malley – the owner of a department store in New Haven - funded much of the legal defence.

In 1999, Virginia McConnell published *Arsenic Under the Elms, Murder in Victorian New Haven* about the 1881 murder and trial, and in a concluding commentary noted: 'Whatever the case, there is no official record of James Malley, Jr., in Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, New York, or Connecticut after August 1883. He simply vanished without leaving a paper trail.' The family subsequently authored an elaborate back story to conceal his whereabouts which I have also addressed in the book. Indeed, McConnell's ob-

servation is supported by James Malley's appearance in Kansas precisely at this point and my book traces his (somewhat nefarious) journey through Kansas, with occasional sojourns back East, and eventually to Washington Territory and San Francisco as an insurance agent, before his eventual arrival in Australia and ultimate elevation to political life. Upon his death in 1953, and as the last member of the first Australian Federal Parliament of 1901, he was honoured with a state funeral in Melbourne.

The persona of 'King' O'Malley has iconic status in Australia. So I was necessarily forensic in my collection of evidence, to ensure I dispelled doubts on what I had uncovered about a famous historical character in the Australian pantheon. The book has numerous points of proof, including photographic evidence, physical evidence, common behaviours and personality traits, personal correspondence, profession and location overlaps, and the common application of religious appellations to his various personas (e.g. Bishop James Malley), as I trace the timeline of his identity change from James Malley Jr to King O'Malley.

The Prologue from my book will provide some further context:

Prologue

King O'Malley is known to history as a 'larrikin' and maverick politician who was a member of the first Australian Federal Parliament, as well as a Federal Minister. His political career spanned two decades, from his election to the South

Australian Parliament in 1896, and his subsequent election to Federal Parliament in 1901, where he remained until his unsuccessful attempts to be re-elected in the 1917 and two subsequent elections.

O'Malley arrived in Australia from the United States in the late 1880s and quickly drew the attention of the populace to his public shenanigans. A combination of his theatrical storytelling, his elaborate and fashionable accourtements, and his generally 'larger than life' persona swept his reputation, like a comet, across the sleepy colonial skies.

In his early forays into the public consciousness he was unabashedly American, willingly playing to the audience with his derring-do stories of Kansas and the Wild West, and the part he played in taming that wilderness. But as he declared himself for election – initially in South Australia - questions were raised about his antecedents, for his American birth precluded him from standing for parliament. However, persons born in Commonwealth countries were eligible to stand, and thus he began to relate an elaborate story; he had been born just across the United States border in Canada where his mother had fled to give birth while his father was away on the Oregon Trail. The ruse – aided and abetted by a letter confirming his antecedents from a long time insurance salesman friend – was sufficient to keep the pretence intact. Yet ongoing questions about his nativity and personal history remained unresolved through to his death in 1953, when he was honoured with a

state funeral. His official biography still refers to his related origins as 'by his own account'.

And thus the first thirty years of his life have remained hidden, Christ-like, behind a shroud he purposefully cast around his history; in truth, the veil he cast was a death shroud soiled with the blood of infamy, for on the other side of the Pacific another story and mystery remained unresolved.

On the 6th August, 1881, the body of a young woman was found washed in by the tide on West Haven beach on Long Island Sound, Connecticut. Jennie Cramer appeared to have been murdered, and James Malley was quickly identified by coronial inquest as the prime suspect along with his cousin, Walter Malley, and Walter's beau, Blanche Douglass.

The trio was arrested and incarcerated until a full trial the subsequent year, which found them not guilty of murder. The outcome was a national and internationally identified miscarriage of justice, bankrolled by Walter's father, department store owner, Edward Malley. Witnesses allegedly 'had their mouths covered in greenbacks'.

Shortly after the trial, James Malley disappears from official records in the north east United States, and the journey begins. Along the trail are numerous locations, characters, personas and multiple aliases. The arc of his masquerade life traced numerous identity changes, and a wide variety of work experiences, driven by a relentless desire to be centre stage, and to seek out and plunder 'the main chance', whatever the cost to his many victims.

James Malley's history comprised a series of unscrupulous

vocations; as a business 'drummer', a lightning rod salesman, an insurance canvasser and fraudster, a prohibitionist, an evangelist, a theatrical agent, a 'bishop' of his own church, and self declared newspaper owner and journalist. His personality leaves a remarkable trail which can be followed during the years following the trial which takes him – and his notoriety to Australia. Meanwhile, in his native state of Connecticut, his family created an elaborate back-story to cover his tracks.

This chronicle predominately addresses the critical hidden years of his life, and reveals the startling truth about why James Malley ultimately fled to the ends of the earth to escape his disrepute. But ultimately the visage is unmasked and the truth revealed. The tale would otherwise appear to be fiction; however it is entirely factual. This is the true story of how James became King.

And after all that, and based on DNA research, I have concluded that in my own case I'm not related to James 'King' O'Malley, although my family directly overlaps with his family in the town of Pittston, Pennsylvania, in the mid to late 1800s.

The book may be of interest to people who like mystery, crime, or history (or all three!) and to O'Malleys in general, as it traces family links with Westport and the US. (James 'King' O'Malley's Uncle Edward (and father of Jane O'Malley-Keyes), stated he was born in Ross House in 1827).

It's a remarkable tale in its own right.



The Pirate Queen, Grace O'Malley and Howth Castle

The Legend of Pirate Queen Grace O'Malley and Howth Castle

Grace O'Malley, also known as Gráinne Mhaol or the Pirate Queen of Ireland, was a legendary figure in Irish history whose life epitomized defiance, resilience, and cunning. Born in 1530 in County Mayo, she was a fearless leader, a skilled navigator, and a chieftain of the Ó Máille clan. Grace's story, woven with exploits on land and sea, remains a source of inspiration, especially her infamous encounter with Howth Castle, a tale that combines daring rebellion and political savvy.

The Howth family honored this agreement, and to this day, a seat remains set for a guest at the castle. The incident exemplifies Grace's wit and her ability to demand respect from even the most powerful families in Ireland.



Legacy of Grace O'Malley



Time to nominate our next Tánaiste, check out the details

Every organisation needs a leader and the O'Malley Clan is no different. If you go back through the mists of time, the O'Malleys most famous leader would be usually acknowledged to have been Granuaile, or Grace O'Malley, often known as The Pirate Queen.

Our current Chieftain, also Grace O'Malley, (but not a pirate!), is leading the O'Malley Clan during 2024 and up to June 2025, where she will host O'Malleys from all around the world at The O'Malley Clan Gathering in Westport in County Mayo on the weekend of 27th to 29th June.

At the end of the annual O'Malley Clan Gathering next June, our current Tánaiste, Denise O'Malley, will take over the reins from Grace and will be inaugurated as the new Chieftain of the O'Malley Clan for the remainder of 2025 up to June of 2026. Denise will then host the annual o'Malley Clan Gathering in County Clare in June of 2026.

As has been done since 1953, a Tánaiste is elected each year as "Chieftain elect" and they then become Chieftain and continue an unbroken line back through the decades.

So what does the O'Malley Clan Chieftain actually do in the 2020's I hear you ask?

There aren't any tribal wars in which the Chieftain will need to lead us into battle thankfully, and so the main role of the Chieftain is ceremonial. Events can pop up from time to time during the year, but the main duty of each Chieftain is to lead the organisation and running of the annual O'Malley Clan Gathering on the last weekend in June each year.

You don't need to have a qualification in event management, so not to worry. There's a great team of folks on the O'Malley Clan Association committee who have literally decades of experience in putting the weekends together. All you'll need is a bit of enthusiaism, and a good sense of humour.

In order to be nominated for the position of Tánaiste you are required to be a current member, and to be nominated, you have to have agreed to be nominated, and are required to be nominated in writing, (the nomination form is below), by two other current members.

Of course if there is more than one nomination, and both nominees wish to contest a particular year, then an election would be held at the Annual General Meeting, on a 50% + 1 basis.

If you're thinking about putting your name forward, and seeking a nomination from some fellow members, don't worry that you're going to be thrown into the deep end and be asked to run the organisation from a standing start. The entire organisational side of things within the O'Malley Clan Association is overseen by the Guardian Chieftain. This position is filled every three years from within the ranks of the former Chieftains of the clan, with the Guardian Chieftain being selected and appointed by the Council of Chieftains. The Guardian Chieftain is there to guide the Chieftain of the day in making their year of office as Chieftain of the O'Malley Clan a success, and chairs the O'Malley Clan Association committee.

So, to conclude, if you'd like to be a part of history, and think you have what it takes to lead this powerful, historic, Irish clan. Have a think about it over the holidays and have a chat with your family or other members.


