The launch of "Grace Notes" by Jennifer Liston



Grace Notes is a collection of poems that express fragments of the life of

Grace O'Malley/Gráinne Mhaol. The Gráinne compositions place Gráinne at different points in her life and also situate her in a mediaeval past and a borrowed future via her dreams, or *aislings*. Interspersed with these compositions are 'rescued' poems. (I've posted many examples and written quite a bit on this site about my 'rescued poetry' process. You could also check out my <u>rescued poetry website.</u>) I chose 17 texts connected to Gráinne – a selection of factual or fictional biographies of her and a small number of contemporary historical texts – from which I rescued 50 poems. 
Brewing up a storm in Ohio with some O'Malley Beer!!

We got a great email recently from one of our Clan Members over in Ohio in the US., Dave Kuhar, and a few friends sent us some pictures of them enjoying Dave's most recent production from his home brew, titled "Grace's Irish Red Ale" It looks fabulous, but you wouldn't want to over do it at 6.7%! Everything is grand in moderation though guys! Great to see it! Happy St Patrick's Day to all the folks in Ohio!



Grace shish, Red Ale honors Grace O'Malley, the legendary Pirate Queen of Ireland, an ancestor of one of our brewers. A smooth, malt-forward ale with a 2-row base malt, Crystal malt for sweetness and amber color, GrarRed malt for body and aroma, and Roasted Barley for a sweet, grainy, coffee-like note. East Kent Golding and Fuggle hops add floral, spicy, and earthy tones, while a classic Irish Ale yeast balances malty richness, stone fruit esters, and dry, nutty tones. At 27 IBU, it's a bold yet balanced tribute to Ireland's fiercest seafarer. Sláintel

Oscar Nominated Kirsten Sheridan with a new movie on Grace!



Oscar-nominated filmmaker Kirsten Sheridan has optioned the rights to the book *Grace O'Malley - The Biography of Ireland's Pirate Queen* by Anne Chambers with production due to begin next year. The feature film, supported by Fís Éireann/Screen Ireland, will be produced by Dublin's Wild Atlantic Pictures in collaboration with the Los Angeles-based Reclaim Entertainment Ventures. Sheridan has been developing the project with author Chambers for a number of years, and it is to be

The film will tell the true story of the meeting between Grace O'Malley and Britain's Queen Elizabeth I. "When her youngest son is taken prisoner, Grace sails right up the Thames to confront Queen Elizabeth directly," said Wild Atlantic Pictures.

"Over the course of just one week, these leaders of two warring nations question each other's identity, pierce each other's wounds, win each other's respect, and come together as equals to define not only their nations, but their most intimate selves."

"Unlike traditional period dramas, Sheridan's vision for the film is raw and contemporary, exploring themes of sexuality, identity, and gender with a fresh and provocative lens," Wild Atlantic Pictures added. "The project will not only depict Grace's legendary exploits but will also dive into her complex personal journey as a leader, mother, and survivor."

gender norms, controlled her own destiny, and stood toe-to-toe with the most powerful woman in history." Sheridan's recent credits include the teleplay for the series *Say Nothing* and executive producing the series *Lockerbie: A Search for Truth*.

In 2004, she was Oscar-nominated alongside her father Jim and her sister Naomi for the screenplay for Jim Sheridan's film *In America*.

Ken O'Malley arrived in Los Angeles from Dublin in 1974 at the age of twenty and has been playing, singing, acting, teaching and producing Irish music ever since. Throughout his career he has appeared in feature films, television, plays and stage productions, and has performed throughout the US and Europe. Ken is a valued historian of Irish music, history and culture and is in constant demand for his wealth of knowledge and experience. He is one of the best known tour guides to Ireland and leads several group trips annually. Ken is the son of the late Raymond O'Malley of Shop Street in Westport, County Mayo. Anne Chambers to visit Galway Museum for an illustrated talk


There's a fabulous illustrated lecture coming up at the Galway City

Time to nominate our next Tánaiste, check out the details

Every organisation needs a leader and the O'Malley Clan is no different. If you go back through the mists of time, the O'Malleys most famous leader would be usually acknowledged to have been Granuaile, or Grace O'Malley, often known as The Pirate Queen.

Our current Chieftain, also Grace O'Malley, (but not a pirate!), is leading the O'Malley Clan during 2024 and up to June 2025, where she will host O'Malleys from all around the world at The O'Malley Clan Gathering in Westport in County Mayo on the weekend of 27th to 29th June.

At the end of the annual O'Malley Clan Gathering next June, our current Tánaiste, Denise O'Malley, will take over the reins from Grace and will be inaugurated as the new Chieftain of the O'Malley Clan for the remainder of 2025 up to June of 2026. Denise will then host the annual o'Malley Clan Gathering in County Clare in June of 2026.

As has been done since 1953, a Tánaiste is elected each year as "Chieftain elect" and they then become Chieftain and continue an unbroken line back through the decades.

So what does the O'Malley Clan Chieftain actually do in the 2020's I hear you ask?

There aren't any tribal wars in which the Chieftain will need to lead us into battle thankfully, and so the main role of the Chieftain is ceremonial. Events can pop up from time to time during the year, but the main duty of each Chieftain is to lead the organisation, and the running of the annual O'Malley Clan Gathering on the last weekend in June each year.

You don't need to have a qualification in event management, so not to worry. There's a great team of folks on the O'Malley Clan Association committee who have literally decades of experience in putting the weekend together. All you'll need is a bit of enthusiaism, and a good sense of humour.

In order to be nominated for the position of Tánaiste you are required to be a current member, and to be nominated, you have to have agreed to be nominated, and are required to be nominated in writing, (the nomination form is below), by two other current members.

Of course if there is more than one nomination, and both nominees wish to contest a particular year, then an election would be held at the Annual General Meeting, on a 50% + 1 basis.

If you're thinking about putting your name forward, and seeking a nomination from some fellow members, don't worry that you're going to be thrown into the deep end and be asked to run the organisation from a standing start. The entire organisational side of things within the O'Malley Clan Association is overseen by the Guardian Chieftain. This position is filled every three years from within the ranks of the former Chieftains of the clan, with the Guardian Chieftain being selected and appointed by the Council of Chieftains. The Guardian Chieftain is there to guide the Chieftain of the day in making their year of office as Chieftain of the O'Malley Clan a success, and chairs the O'Malley Clan Association committee.

So, to conclude, if you'd like to be a part of history, and think you have what it takes to lead this powerful, historic, Irish clan. Have a think about it and have a chat with your family or other members.


